

In an emergency:

- Ensure you are in a safe place
- Call the emergency services on 999 or 112
- Radio to other club members if appropriate (e.g. safety launch drivers)
- The nearest Land Line telephone is in the Café at the water front
- First Aid Kits are available in
 - o TTARC Boathouse
 - o TTARC Safety Launch
 - Talkin Tarn Cafe
- The nearest **Defibrillator (AED)** is at the side of the Café by the water front

Evacuation in the event of an Emergency

Inside the clubhouse

- leave by the nearest, signed, emergency exit
- Assemble outside the café building

On the water

- Stay with your boat.
- Attract attention from the Safety Launch or other rowers if necessary
- Return to the landing stage if possible
- Get to the water's edge if you are unable to return to the landing stage.

Suspension of club activities

- The decision to suspend rowing/ activities may be taken by Safety officer, Coaches or club Captain/ Vice Captain in conjunction (where appropriate) with safety launch drivers.
- Should this be necessary, those people shall ensure this is communicated to all relevant persons on the water, and ensure that all persons are safely retrieved to land.
- The usual Club communications methods may be used to notify members of ongoing/ imminent suspension of activities.
